Door Supervision

Unless a government department employs you such as the Ministry of Defence a Door supervisor will work within the Private Security industry.

Door supervisors usually work at licenced premises or anywhere alcohol is served, however Door supervisors can also work in a wide variety of roles including static guarding, manned guarding, key holding, and events etc.

Successful achievement of this course is the first stage in applying for your Door Supervisor license from the Security Industry Authority (SIA) whom are responsible for regulating the Private Security industry covering the following modules.

- Unit 1 - Working in the Private Security Industry
- Unit 2 - Working as a Door Supervisor
- Unit 3 - Conflict Management for the Private Security Industry
- Unit 4 - Physical Intervention skills for the Private Security Industry

Eligibility

- Must be 18 years of age
- Must have a satisfactory level of spoken, written, and reading English

Delivery

Duration: 45 hours

This is a combination of both theory and practical exercises with multiple choice examinations and one practical assessment with the course covering the four units;

- Unit 1 - Working in the Private Security Industry
- Unit 2 - Working as a Door Supervisor
- Unit 3 - Conflict Management for the Private Security Industry
